In the Interim: How Well Are We Known

I recently shared some reflections with St. Peder's Leadership – thoughts about conversations I've been having with people outside of the congregation about St. Peder's. As an Interim Pastor these conversations seem to come up quite naturally in conversation.

I've had a number of conversations where the generous spirit of St. Peder's has been noted. Organiza-

tions that are aware of our generosity are grateful for our financial gifts as well as the gifts of our time and skills. Sometimes the acts of love we do may not seem like much to us, but are deeply appreciated by the recipients, even if we never hear the thank yous.

I have had other conversations recently where I've heard people who are unsure where St. Peder's is located or aren't aware of the work we've done as a congregation over the years. Admittedly, even the best-connected person in a community won't know every organization or business.

We have a positive working relationship with Minnehaha Academy Lower Campus. One of their administrators stopped by to discuss a solution to traffic challenges created by the redesign of 42nd Street. Our residential neighbors also feel comfortable approaching us for various reasons, including inviting us to be part of Community events.

It may be worth noting just how many things have changed in our neighborhood over the past 2 years. What new businesses have opened in that time? Who has moved out of our neighborhood – and who has moved in? How have our patterns of involvement in the community changed – as individuals or as a church?

The Transition Team has now completed our three "listening sessions" with the congregation. In each session we heard comments from individuals that they felt they got to know their fellow St. Peder's members better through this process. This isn't to say we didn't know one another before, but even in our closest relationships we can always dig deeper and get to know one another better.

As the Transition Team meets in the next few weeks we'll discuss the themes that emerged from the gatherings and how those will inform

It's Time to Vote by Kristi Erickson

Once again it is time to vote. Our vote is our voice, please let your voice be heard.

This year many communities are voting in municipal elections, but there are no state wide elections. Minneapolis will hold general elections for Mayor, the 13 City Council seats, Board of Estimate and Taxation (2 at large seats), Park and Recreation (6 districts and 3 at large seats) and 3 ballot questions. Other communities may be voting on City Officers, School Board Members, Township Offices and/or local ballot questions. You can begin now to consider the issues that are important to you and learn about the platforms and views of the candidates. Additionally, review all ballot questions and be sure you understand what a yes or no vote means.

Minneapolis voters are encouraged to study their three ballot questions closely. Question 2, especially, has received a large amount of media attention. Two political organizations are providing information for voters, click here and here and here to read more. As a racial justice team, we hope you will engage your heart and mind while pondering the question and be aware there are members of the Black, Indigenous, People of Color (BIPOC) community on both sides of the issue.

Tuesday November 2, 2021, is Election Day. You can choose to vote on Election Day or vote early. Minnesota allows any voter to request a ballot by mail. You can also vote in person early. Here's what you need to know.

- Information to register to vote, request a ballot, vote in person early, poll locations, and county election office addresses can be found at Elections and Voting or Vote Minneapolis
- For non-computer users, use election phone numbers: Metro Area: 651-215-1440, Greater MN: 1-877-600-VOTE (8683), or contact your county election office.
- If you are a resident of Minneapolis, get a sample ballot and learn about ballot information including offices, candidates, and questions at What's on the ballot.
- If you are not a resident of Minneapolis, check to see if your community votes this year at regularly scheduled elections or use Polling Place Finder. You can also find names of candidates and questions that will be on the ballot for your precinct at My Ballot.

Minneapolis uses ranked choice voting (RCV) for municipal offices. RCV is a voting method where you vote for candidates in order of your preference. You may vote for three candidates, ranking them as first choice, second choice, and third choice, but choosing a second or third candidate is not required. This method can allow your vote to count toward another candidate if your favorite candidate loses. For example, if your first choice doesn't win, your vote is transferred to your second choice. RCV is not used in elections for school board or for county, state, or federal offices.

Vote by Mail

Request a ballot online, or compete the MN ballot application found on website above, by Oct 19. Upon receipt of ballot, read instructions carefully and make selections. Return the application soon after completing. Information for return can be found on website above. If returned by mail, it must be received by 8pm Nov 2. Mailed ballots can also be returned in person to the election office that sent your ballot, or dropped off at early 'in person" voting places, no later than 3pm on Nov 2. Ballots may NOT be dropped at your polling place.

Vote Early in Person

Minneapolis early voting is in progress at the Elections and Voter Service Center, 980 E. Hennepin Ave, through Mon, Nov 1, 2021. Hours are M-F 8am-4:30pm, with extended hours 7am-6pm M-F, Oct 18-29, and last two weekends of Oct. Non-Minneapolis voters can vote in person at your county election office. Election office locations and clerk phone numbers can be found at <u>vote early in person</u>.

Vote on Election Day, November 2

Polling places are usually open from 7am to 8pm. You can find your poll location and hours on above websites. In Minnesota you can register to vote or update your registration at your polling place on Election Day with proof of residence.

The Council and staff will continue to monitor the COVID-19 situation and will make any adjustments as needed.

We have some exciting events coming up for the fall and are moving forward with planning for some special musical services, modified Æbleskive Sunday, and more. We are excited to welcome back our Shepherding Groups (find the schedule here) and our delicious coffee and fellowship time. A detailed schedule can be found on our website here. We will have limited indoor seating and will encourage everyone to be outside for fellowship time as much as possible. We will also have grab and go options!

Online Sunday school kicks off on Sunday, September 26 and we have some fun interactive Zoom lessons ready to go around the theme "Advent in fall". So often the important Advent lessons get missed as December is a busy time in the church, so we are adding them in early. These lessons will build to a Christmas Pageant in December. Upcoming sessions are October 10th and 17th.

Special thanks to our Interim Pastor Eric and Transition Team leaders for leading some great sessions over the past few months. I look forward to learning about the key values and ideas that came out of this work that will go into our Ministry Site Profile as we prepare to call a new Pastor for St. Peder's.

RIVERSIDE Riverside Innovation Hub Learning Cohort Update: INNOVATION HUB A Walk Around the Neighborhood by Karen Vetsch

As we continue our work with the Riverside Innovation Hub (https://www.augsburg.edu/riversidehub/) our team has met online with others involved in the Learning Cohort to better understand the work ahead of us.

Our first "assignment" was to do a Prayer Walk of our neighborhood. Even determining what "neighborhood" meant was a bit of a challenge - does that mean just a few blocks around the physical church? Is it the whole Longfellow Community? Our team focused our walk in the blocks adjacent to church with some of us walking a few blocks North, others South, and others to the West and East.

The day we walked was quiet so we mostly noticed structures and signs. Many homes are showing their age, others have been torn down and replaced, buildings that were once businesses converter to residences. Signs that cry out for social justice and community concerns that reflect the progressive majority in the community. Homes for sale at prices that seem out of reach for first-time home buyers raising the question, "who is moving in to this neighborhood?"

As we talked about our observations our team kept pondering the question "what does it mean to be a good neighbor in the community that surrounds St. Peder's?" This is a question that drives our work and helps to inform our congregation of how we might **be** the church in the years to come and how each of us as members might find ways to experience the good news that surrounds us.

how we answer questions on the Ministry Site Profile. The Team will then share these insights and information with the congregation to get a sense of whether these learnings reflect where God is leading us in the future and characteristics of the pastor who will join us in that journey.

In the meantime, I invite you to take notice of the neighborhood as you journey around St. Peder's. Invite God to help you notice something you haven't noticed before. Think about ways we as a church might be present in our neighborhood. Consider the places of good news in our neighborhood and how we might amplify that good news to our neighbors.
