Hello and welcome to October!

This month, I wanted to introduce, on behalf of the St Peder's Reconciling in Christ task force, the new proposed RIC welcome statement. We'll be voting to officially replace our older one at the next annual meeting, but I think that it's a really amazing statement and one that can begin having an impact on us now.



As a community of the people of God, we are called to be in ministry with all people of our world, knowing that the world can be unloving and an unwelcoming place. Our world is a place of injustice, alienation, divisiveness, and brokenness. Christ calls us to reconciliation, wholeness, and community. We strive to be a place of peace, rest, and to be made whole by God's infinite love and grace.

- -St. Peder's welcomes all people. We welcome every race, culture, age, ability, family structure, economic status, sexual orientation, gender identity, and gender expression.
- -As a congregation, we humbly commit: to the holy work of listening, learning, and repentance; to transform traditions and practices that are harmful, unjust or unwelcoming; and to grow in ways to act in God's love by advocating for anti-racism, LGBTQIA+ rights, social and economic justice and environmental stewardship.
- -We are all parts of the body of Christ and unique individuals created by God. We love and accept everyone as they are. We commit to honor everyone's unique experiences and gifts as we journey together in Christ.

All Are Welcome Here!

When I met with the group last month, I was struck by a few observations made in the discussion. First, that this statement is a statement of intention. This is who we intend to be. We intend to be a place of welcome, of hospitality, of relationships, and justice. As a congregation, we are on a journey of becoming this kind of community. As such, this statement is something we can measure up to; we can revisit it and see if what we are doing reflects what we say we believe.

Secondly, and related to the first, is that this statement means very little if people do not feel it when they are with us. Paul, writing to the Christian church in Corinth, says is this way: "If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal." (1 Corinthians 13:1) Without the love to back this statement up, without the intentional practice of welcoming people and building relationships with them, this statement means very little.

Fall Faith Formation Update

Our Faith Formation for the new school year has started and we are so thankful for the families, parents, and volunteers who are giving so generously of their time and energy to build up the congregation. Here is a brief rundown of our current plan:

Youth Faith Formation will begin in worship. After the Children's Message, Pastor Bryan will invite the children out for their classes. If the class activities are finished before worship is done, they'll come back and finish worship with the adults. Otherwise, parents can grab coffee and treats and wait until they're finished after worship.

There is still time to sign up students and teachers. If you would like to teach, please let us know. There will be a calendar and resources put together so that teachers are able to make sure that teachers are able to attend worship and work around other plans.

Adult Faith Formation will happen following worship and treats. It will start, approximately, at 10:30. There will be a mix of presentations and discussions. Occasionally, other resources, such as books, will be used, but we want to make sure that most classes are hospitable to all people, whether they've had time to prepare or not.

On October 23rd and 30th, and November 6th, Adult Faith Formation will be reviewing Shannon Kearns book, *Into the Margins: A Transgender Man's Journey with Scripture*, with Shannon planning to join us on November 6th via Zoom. We hope you can join us (more info below!)

Adult Faith Formation: Book Study

Join us on three consecutive Sundays—October 23, October 30 and November 6--at 10:15 for a discussion of Shannon's provocative book, In the Margins. And as a special attraction, Shannon himself will join us via Zoom for the final session!



Mini Book Review In the Margins:

A Transgender Man's Journey through Scripture

Our beloved former Director of Faith Formation, Shannon Kearns, has written an astounding book, and one particularly relevant to St. Peder's aspirational mission statement goal to live the gospel with open hands. open hearts and open doors. It is first an incredibly moving memoir about his painful journey as a Christian growing up in a rigid and shaming evangelical church, trying to fit in when he clearly could not, and his ultimate realization that he was transgender. But it is much more than that. It is also a beautiful and profound reading of the Bible with mes-

sages of hope that resonate not only with trans people but with all people who struggle on the margins of society, or who have ever felt like a square peg in a round hole, and with all Christians focused on the inclusive, social justice messages of Jesus. Why Shannon remained a Christian, despite his upbringing, is epitomized by his inspiring reading of the Easter story. The book makes me so grateful that we had Shannon here for six years—and makes me realize in retrospect how much we learned from him and, at the same time, how much more we have to learn. Get the book—you won't be sorry!

Confirmation Update

Our plans for Confirmation classes are coming together. Pastor Bryan and Pastor Shawna (of Minnehaha Communion Lutheran Church) have been in conversation and have put together a good plan for the academic year. Classes will begin on October 12 and will be held onceper-month for 2 hours. It will begin with dinner together, include lessons and games, and will go from 5:30-7:30.

October 12 - Basics of the Bible - Minnehaha Communion

November 9 - Lutheranism 101 - St. Peder's

December 12 - Healthy Relationships - Minnehaha Communion

January 11 - What Happens in Worship - St. Peder's

February 8 - Honoring our Neighbor's Faith - Minnehaha Communion

March 8 - Caring for Creation - St. Peder's

April 12 - TBD - Minnehaha Communion

May 10 - TBD - St. Peder's

We will also be planning a trip in the spring to visit a small organic farm to help us learn more about how faith and care for creation are intertwined. More details will be coming at a later date about that trip.

We ask that students please bring a Bible if they have one (let Pastor Bryan know if you need one) When classes are at Minnehaha Communion, please enter the side door on the sidewalk level. Dinners are provided, but please let Pastor Bryan know if there are any dietary restrictions.

RIH October Update by Judy Anderson

Last week Bethel Lutheran, which takes up an entire city block in south Minneapolis (17th Ave and 42nd St), hosted a social hour for the Innovation Hub cohort churches. Bethel's pastor, Pastor



Brenda, explained that as a congregation they feel called to share their abundant space and have intentionally designed it with their community in mind. An open, outdoor food shelf sits at one entrance. There are three different garden spaces: a rooftop solar garden, a rain garden, and a large community garden maintained by the Bancroft Neighborhood Association, which is also housed within Bethel's building. An unobtrusive labyrinth is tucked away among trees and benches. As we sat outside on a late summer evening, a young family enjoyed the natural playground. Across the parking lot a group of teenagers were having fun on the basketball court. One of the attendees likened these spaces to "people feeders" in the way they provide nourishment to the neighborhood.

The Riverside Innovation Hub uses Ezekiel's Vision (Ezekiel 47:1-12) as a key, grounding text in its approach to the public church framework. In this vision, water (God's creative love) flows away from the temple and out into the world, giving hope and comfort and life. I saw this vision reflected in the creative ways that Bethel shares their abundance with the wider community. This is the concept behind the Public Church, to open our doors and share ourselves and our blessings with our neighbors.
