Adult Faith Formation: December 6th



On **December 6th at 10** we'll be discussing the book "Native: Identity, Belonging, and Rediscovering God" by Kaitlin B. Curtice. It is available on Audible as an audiobook.

Native is about identity, soul-searching, and the never-ending journey of finding ourselves and finding God. As both a citizen of the Potawatomi Nation and a Christian, Kaitlin Curtice offers a unique perspective on these topics. In this book, she shows how reconnecting with her Potawatomi identity both informs and challenges her faith.

Curtice draws on her personal journey, poetry, imagery, and stories of the Potawatomi people to address themes at the forefront of today's discussions of faith and culture in a positive and constructive way. She encourages us to embrace our own origins and to share and listen to each other's stories so we can build a more inclusive and diverse future. Each of our stories matters for the church to be truly whole. As Curtice shares what it means to experience her faith through the lens of her Indigenous heritage, she reveals that a vibrant spirituality has its origins in identity, belonging, and a sense of place.



"Greening" Your Holiday

This Holiday Season, like the rest of 2020, will be a unique experience. While many of us mourn the "pause" placed on traditional events, we also have an opportunity to create new traditions. Please consider making some of your new traditions "green." *Gift Giving:*

- ♦ Give sustainable gifts. This includes items that are designed to last longer, be fashionable for a longer period of time, made of natural materials, etc.
- ♦ Look for items with less packaging. Packaging makes up the majority of household waste. By reducing packaging (much of which is not recyclable) you greatly reduce your environmental footprint. Recycle paper packaging. Plastic packaging that stretches when pulled can generally be recycled at plastic bag recycling sites.
- Give experiences. This could include gift cards to restaurants and theaters, or home-made gift cards for family adventures such as a skiing or skating outing. A nice by-product of experience gifts is you can support local small businesses.

Decorating:

- ♦ Make your own decorations from items found in nature or around the house.
- ♦ Consider switching to LED bulbs. LED Christmas lights use light-emitting diodes, rather than filament to produce light. While LED lights cost more, they are more efficient, durable, and longer-lasting than fluorescent incandescent lights. They also don't get hot to the touch, so they're a lot safer.
- Use a timer on your lights to save energy. And, with timers you can set your lights to be on when you awaken or when returning home from a long day. Good news for December's late dawns and early sunsets!

Gift Wrapping and Cards:

- Consider making your own wrapping from newsprint, grocery bags, old art projects, etc. We frequently use re-usable decorative tins (such as cookie tins) and fabric ribbon to wrap gifts.
- Foil, cellophane and plastic-coated wrapping paper, as well as paper with glitter, cannot be recycled. A rule of thumb is that if you scrunch the paper, and it stays scrunched in a tight ball, it is paper-based and can be recycled. Remove bows and ribbons before recycling.
- ♦ Consider using e-cards. While it is nice to get an actual card (perhaps more so in 2020 and USPS could use the help), some people might appreciate a "no waste" e-card.
- Greeting cards with glitter, metallic accents or plastic cannot be recycled and should be placed in the trash. Photo paper greeting cards also cannot be recycled curb side. Recycle envelopes (remove any foil inserts first). No need to remove the stamps from the envelope. Look for cards made from recycled paper.
