#### Dear Church,

With sadness I bring you the news that Presiding Bishop Emeritus Herbert W. Chilstrom died at home early this morning (Sunday, January 19). His wife, Pastor Corinne Chilstrom; his son, Chris Holt; and family were with him.

Bishop Chilstrom was the first presiding bishop of the ELCA. Many of you knew him in those early days when the ELCA was just getting started – there was no furniture at the Lutheran Center, files were in boxes, phones were on the floor, and the skeleton staff worked on card tables and folding chairs. He was once told by a corporate executive sitting next to him on a plane that this was no way to start a corporation and it would never work. Thirty-three years later we are still here, entrusted with the ministry of the gospel and serving the neighbor.

I can't imagine the uncertainty and chaos of those first months, but all I know we were filled with hope for this new church the Spirit had brought into being. And I know that Bishop Chilstrom served out of the conviction that it was God's will to raise up an ELCA witness to the gospel, and with God, all things are possible.

I remember Bishop Chilstrom saying once that his mother told him: "Herb, you might be the only Bible some people read." It was her way of telling him, and his way of telling us, that we are living witnesses to the grace of God.

Bishop Chilstrom chose "Rejoice, Ye Pure in Heart!" (ELW, 873) to be the sending hymn at his funeral. Verse five announces:

At last the march shall end:

The wearied ones shall rest;

The pilgrims find their home at last,

Jerusalem the blest.

Rejoice! Give thanks and sing!

Through tears, but in the sure and certain hope of the resurrection, we rejoice.

# February 9, 16, 23: Book study on "Dear Church" by Rev. Lenny Duncan led by Shannon Kearns



Lenny Duncan is the unlikeliest of pastors. Formerly incarcerated, he is now a black preacher in the whitest denomination in the United States: the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). Shifting demographics and shrinking congregations make all the headlines, but Duncan sees something else at work--drawing a direct line between the church's lack of diversity and the church's lack of vitality. The

problems the ELCA faces are theological, not sociological. But so are the answers.

Part manifesto, part confession, and all love letter, Dear Church offers a bold new vision for the future of Duncan's denomination and the broader mainline Christian community of faith. Dear Church rejects the narrative of church decline and calls everyone--leaders and laity alike--to the front lines of the churchÂs renewal through racial equality and justice.

It is time for the church to rise up, dust itself off, and take on forces of this world that act against God: whiteness, misogyny, nationalism, homophobia, and and economic injustice. Duncan gives a blueprint for the way forward and urges us to follow in the revolutionary path of Jesus.

There will be no Faith Formation for adults on February 2 because of Shepherding Group Sunday.

# A Green 2020 by Judy Hogan

Pretty much everyone I know recycles to some extent. Most places make it easy for us to choose to put a pop can or water bottle into the recycling vs the trash. But, most of us don't recycle as much, as consistently or as accurately as we could. So, before we begin talking about what to recycle, lets take a look at three good reasons to recycle.



We've seen a lot of change in waste management. Many of us can recall when back yard burning barrels and open dumps were the standard way to dispose of trash.

Environmental – In Hennepin County 74% of our trash is made up of materials that can be recycled or composted (measured by weight in 2013). This gives us a huge opportunity to reduce the amount of trash put into local landfills – and reduces the need to convert more acres into future landfills. We can also keep much of our trash out of our municipal waste incinerator. Yes, the incinerator does produce energy, but even the most

advanced technologies cannot avoid the release of heavy metals, dioxins and other toxins that can contribute to global warming, contaminate air, soil and water, and end up entering the food chain.

**Economic** – This one can surprise many people. Did you know that in Hennepin County alone recycling supports 3,725 jobs? In the state there are well over 11,000 people employed in this field. In an assessment of 2018 economic impact, recycling and composting provided \$251M in wages at the county level (\$784M at the state level) and an overall economic impact of \$746M (county) and \$2.3B (state). This puts the recycling industry on par with the radio and television, building services, and warehousing/storage industries.

Spiritual – This one gets a little more personal, but please indulge me. Many people fall short of their recycling potential because they believe that their efforts won't really make a difference. "What can one person do?" Also, for many of us the biggest environmental issues seem far in the future – perhaps they are even "after I'm dead" concerns. I consider recycling an act of trust – trust that if I take an action, that action will be repeated by enough other humans that together we can make a difference. I also see recycling/composting a small act of providing for our youth and future generations. It's a way of blessing them - not just in thought or word, but in action.

Over the next few months I'll be sharing more background information about the power and act of recycling/composting. I'll also be posting information at church as well as sharing information with Shepherding Groups, and others who plan events. Please contact me if you have questions or would like added information about recycling/composting.
