A Farewell Message from Shannon



Dear, beloved, St. Peder's people,

In May of 2015 I walked into my new office for the first time and had no idea what the future would hold. Entering a new community is scary. What if you don't understand the norms and the customs? What if you don't get along? What if you make people mad?

Over the past six years as we have journeyed together you have graciously taught me your customs: from snippets of Danish, to my new love of Æbleskiver and to the Grundtvig tradition. We have sometimes disagreed and I am sure that I've made some of you mad. And yet, as I reflect back on the last six years the word that comes through loudest and strongest is love.

You have loved me well and I am eternally grateful for that.

I hope you have felt my love in return. Even as I pushed and prodded, as I exhorted and poked, as I learned and failed in public. This has been such a safe place to minister and I thank you for your trust in me these last years.

Thank you for entrusting me with your children and youth. For inviting me into your lives and your tender moments, for sharing your stories, and your ideas, and your beliefs with me. Thank you, too, for sharing your doubts.

Many of you have asked me "What's next?" And if I've seemed not to answer it's not in the spirit of being cagey, it's because I honestly don't know; at least not in the sense of a next "official" job or ministry. Part of this leave taking was inspired by a deep sense in my soul that I need to be spending the bulk of my energy on creative work. For me, the impulse to write comes from the same impulse that calls me to ministry: The desire to get people together, tell a story, and make meaning together. And from that meaning making to go out into the world and try to make it a better place. It's what we do together in church on Sundays, it's what we do in the theatre; it's the same impulse in both places. I'm feeling called to put more of my energy into those stories. I don't know what will happen career wise. This is, in some ways, a leap of faith.

I do plan to continue my online ministry with QueerTheology.com, cultivating a space and community for LGBTQ+ people, many of whom are still trying to make sense of their faith because of harm they have experienced in the church. I want to carry the love I have found with all of you to them, to assure them there are places where their sexuality and gender identity aren't a hindrance but a blessing to them and their community.

In the Interim: Transition and Change Pastor Eric Luedtke

It feels a bit like a broken record to mention the reality that we are living in a time of significant transition and change. Our headlines constantly remind us of the ways our world has been upended. In the life of St. Peder's we've experienced significant staff turnover. Our neighborhoods are fragile as we continue to recover from the unrest of a year ago. In these times we are reminded of God's word through the prophet Isaiah:

Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand. ~Isaiah 41:10

It is important to name the realities that we are facing so that we can do something about them. If we act like the ostrich with our heads in the sand, nothing will get better. But, if we name and face the challenges of our lives then there is hope that something can be done to move forward. It's a lot easier to face the challenges of our world when we recognize that we are not alone in what we face. We have a community of faith, we have our families, we have our God.

It is a real blessing to gather in person for worship outdoors. For the first time in a year or more many of us gathered together in one place as God's people. We are able to engage one another in conversation and SEE the reaction. I've heard time and again how much the children have grown and changed since last seen. It's a good reminder that this is a good time to be God's people.

As summer returns to Minnesota we have also formed our Transition Team that will lead us into the process of discussing who we are as a congregation and what kind of leadership we need to carry St. Peder's forward. These conversations will be rich with story of our rootedness, marked with memories, and fueled by dreams and visions for who we might become. Be watching for opportunities to engage in conversation together and be part of this Transition Team work.

In addition to the Transition Team, St. Peder's was recently invited to participate in a two-year learning opportunity to partner with the Riverside Innovation Hub (RIH) alongside 11 other local congregations. Together we will engage in a process of engaging our neighbors to discover how we might better respond to and participate in the places where the Good News (gospel) is emerging in our community. You'll be hearing more about these opportunities in the coming months as we begin to engage this work.

There's a lot happening at St. Peder's and you are a part of it.

You all have shaped me in profound ways. There aren't enough words to say enough thank you for the last six years, but know that my heart is overflowing with gratitude for all of you. I will carry your ministry to my spirit with me wherever I go. Know that whatever I do next, you all will have a part in it.


Survey Says ...

Results of the Spring Return to Worship Survey

Thank you for those who took the time to participate in our Spring Return to Worship Survey. We had 76 responses which provides Council with concrete feedback on how comfortable our congregation is to return to in-person gatherings.

From the survey, nearly all adult respondents are already vaccinated or plan to be vaccinated. From the perspective of many medical officials, this means the St. Peder's community have arrived at "herd immunity" making our ability to gather in person much safer.


Please tell us (if you are willing): Do you expect to have been vaccinated by mid-May? 71 responses



Also from the survey, just over 90% of our congregation are comfortable or very comfortable attending Outdoor in-person worship, while only slightly more than 50% would be comfortable or very comfortable attending Indoor in-person worship. This has led to Council decision to not return to indoor worship gatherings just yet.


How comfortable would you be attending worship OUTDOORS this summer? (with masks and social distancing required)

One of the primary comments offered for the level of discomfort around indoor gathering is the limited access to vaccination for children and youth. This was also reflected in the percentage of those with children who are very comfortable with indoor vs. outdoor gatherings for events focused on our children and youth.

With full recognition that some of our members are uncomfortable with (or unable to) participating in in-person gatherings at this time, we will continue to offer online worship options using our website, Zoom, and Facebook.

While the CDC and Minnesota Department of Health have lifted many restrictions, they have also encouraged businesses and organizations to retain guidelines they feel are best practices for their organization.

The current plan for St. Peder's is that we will continue to limit in-person indoor gatherings to small groups. We will gather for in-person worship outdoors (see schedule on page 3). We are hopeful that with continued decline in COVID case numbers and increased vaccination of all ages, we can safely return to in-person indoor gatherings in the Fall. Maximizing Your Gift to St. Peder's

We are very fortunate at St. Peder's to have a membership that gives generously to support our mission. The use of debit and credit cards to make donations continues to grow. These methods are great for the ease and simplicity they provide in making a gift.

We want to make sure people have information regarding the fees charged by the credit card companies and other "middle men" with the goal of making sure you chose the right option for you. We would love to have your gifts to St. Peder's maximized and offer a range of ways to give. In general, fees on credit and debit card transactions run about 2.5% to 3.75% of the amount given, and sometimes more.

Many people are aware of these fees and add an amount to cover their cost. This means St. Peder's receives the full amount of their gift.

This issue becomes most apparent when gifts are essentially passed through St. Peder's to go to other organizations such as the food shelf, or in the recent flower sale. In these situations we pass along the full amount we receive, after any deductions are made.

You can avoid paying transaction fees by setting up your donation to be drawn directly from your bank account. For example, if you are using a debit card to make your gift, transaction fees will be incurred. Setting up the transaction so it is drawn directly from your bank account will result in St. Peder's receiving 100 percent of your gift.

The most important thing is that you set up your giving in a way that works for you. We are grateful for ALL gifts we receive. We want to make sure you have the information so you can choose the giving method you want.

From the Racial Justice Team.....



Each month we will be sharing some thought provoking statements or questions for you to consider. We hope you'll take a few moments to engage your heart and e mind while pondering them.

Something to Ponder.....

An anti-racism book for everyone, Caste, by Isabel Wilkerson – The Star Tribune tells us: The Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist examines aspects of caste systems across civilizations and reveals a rigid hierarchy in America today. It is about power-who has it and who does not.

An excerpt gives us an analogy: a curtain rises on a stage, actors wear costumes and are assigned roles, the costumes were handed out at birth and cues cast to the roles they are to play and to their place on the stage. The show has been running for centuries. The cast members become associated with their roles - typecast. As an actor, you are told to stick to the script and the part you are cast to play.

The author also discusses at length the caste systems of India and Nazi Germany.

The caste system in America is four hundred years old and persists because we, each, allow it to exist. Isabel Wilkerson ends her book with this statement: A world without caste would set everyone free.

Consider:

- What have I noticed about the caste system in America?
- In what ways do my actions allow the caste system to exist?
- Do I elevate or demean people based on physical traits such as skin color?
- How can I begin to see past the physical traits and value the character of the person?
