In the Interim

Pastor Eric Luedtke, Interim Pastor

As we head into December, we are surrounded by a number of transitions. The weather is turning wintery, the liturgical calendar sends us into Advent, and we at St. Peder's are moving into the next stage of our transition process.

With great congregational input from our gatherings over the summer, the Transition Team has been working hard to encapsulate your thoughts and ideas into the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) this is the document that prospective Pastors will receive to learn about St. Peder's and the ministry of this congregation.

On Sunday, December 5, we have an opportunity as a congregation to meet with Bishop Ann Svennungsen to discuss this document and for her to ask clarifying questions so that she and her staff can help identify potential candidates for St. Peder's.

In the new year the Call Committee, a separate team from the Transition Team, will begin their work. The Call Committee will prayerfully consider potential candidates, interview them, and then recommend a candidate to be called by the congregation as the next pastor for St. Peder's Lutheran Church. The congregation will then vote to extend a call to this candidate. We might anticipate this process to take much of the winter with a new pastor potentially starting by Easter.

As we eagerly anticipate the transition to a new pastor, if you have any questions, please reach out to a Council member or Pastor Eric.

The Transition Team is nearly complete with their work in preparing the Ministry Site Profile (MSP). On Sunday, December 5 we invite the congregation to meet with Bishop Ann Svennungsen of the Minneapolis Area Synod, as we share conversation around the MSP that willhelp Bishop Ann and her staff identify potential candidates as St. Peder's next pastor.

Prior to the meeting the Transition Team will share a summary of the MSP to help you prepare for the conversation with Bishop Ann.

RIVERSIDE December Updates for Riverside Innovation Hub INNOVATION HUB By Karen Vetsch

This work is hard and uncomfortable. We are trying to move forward with an unknown process. Our task was to start a conversation with a stranger, hoping to find a common element. Yet, how do we make the first connection?

Last month we updated you that our group is entering the "get to know our neighbor" or trying to be in accompaniment with our neighbor phase. As a reminder, accompaniment may start as being a listener at a community meeting or scheduling a one-to-one conversation over coffee for the sheer sake of getting to know someone new. When we pause and reflect on accompaniment, it often leads us to find places where God is already present in our communities, maybe simply dressed in a way we weren't expecting. Conversations could lead to learning some of the many ways St. Peder's church can be used in God's plans.

Being tasked to actually connect with people in our community and have one-on-one conversations is out of my comfort zone. We go forward with this work in the hopes of finding friends and learning together how St. Peder's church is recognized in our community. We hope to learn how we can become a better neighbor.

Good news is that we have about three months to begin the work on this phase. I will tell you that I am dragging my feet. I will also tell you that I have started to "practice" with friends in our congregation. The conversations have been informative, genuine and comforting. For now I will leave you with that. Next update you should be reading about reflections & learnings from others in our group.



Pub Theology




