#### Holy Week 2022

As we draw to the close of the season of Lent, we engage the story of Jesus from the confusion of the Triumphal Entry on Palm Sunday through the pain of trial and crucifixion culminating in the joy of resurrection on Easter Sunday. The services of Holy Week build upon one another like chapters in a book. We hope you will make this part of your worship journey from Lent into Easter — and please invite friends and family to join us as well.

#### Palm Sunday, April 10 at 9:00 a.m.

Jesus enters Jerusalem to cheers of Hosanna! The people are expecting the Messiah to bring change, but Jesus knows they are not expecting what is to come in the week ahead. Join us in worship as we raise palm branches and join in the crowd that welcomes Jesus to Jerusalem.

#### Maundy Thursday, April 14 at 7:00 p.m.

Jesus and his disciples gather for the Passover meal where the host becomes servant and sets a new mandate (command) in front of them, "love one another as I have loved you." This worship service includes Holy Communion.

#### Good Friday, April 15 at 7:00 p.m.

A service of Tenebrae (darkness) reflecting on the seven last words of Jesus. As we ponder the solemnity of Christ's death on a cross, we grieve with Mary and the disciples, but we also know this isn't the end of the story.

## Easter Sunday, April 17: 9:00 am and 10:45 am Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen Indeed!

A jubilant ensemble of musicians lead us in joyous hymns and bold acclamation as we witness the empty tomb revealing Jesus is alive and that we are called to proclaim that Good News through open hearts, open hands and open doors. We celebrate Holy Communion as part of our worship and invite you to join us for a celebratory time of fellowship and feasting between the two worship services.

## In the Interim: Easter People by Pastor Eric Luedtke, Interim Pastor

As we approach the end of Lent and the celebration of Easter, I am reminded of Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton's proclamation that as Lutherans we are "Easter People." Particularly as an Interim Pastor, I find a lot of en-

couragement in that proclamation because I recognize that congregations that are in transition are moving from one part of their story to another, one chapter to the next.

We don't typically like to use the metaphor of death to talk about things that once were, maybe because we are fundamentally uncomfortable with the idea of our own mortality. But the promise of resurrection resonates loudly for many of us because we can focus on what is next.

At St. Peder's we have done our share of lamenting "what was" whether that be prepandemic or maybe another stage of the life of the congregation. But you are not dwelling there. You are Easter People. You are looking forward to what God is doing next.

Rejoice, Easter People! Remember God is leading the way.

## RIVERSIDE April Update for Riverside Innovation Hub by Judy Anderson

If you've been following our team's progress with the Riverside Innovation Hub (RIH), by now you've heard about Accompaniment, the initial stage of getting to know who our neighbors are. Lately we've been identifying the key themes that emerged from our conversations, including:

**Partnership**. Our neighbors are looking for opportunities to engage, to share with one another. There is a desire for ways to gather. Several neighbors mentioned that our location on a busy street corner makes it an ideal neighborhood space for sharing and being a community partner.

**Land Stewardship**. One of the things our neighbors like best about the neighborhood is proximity to the river and parks. Being good stewards of our land is a high priority for many of our neighbors.

**Fear**. Rising crime, especially car jackings and home break-ins. Racial and economic injustice. (un)Affordable housing. High anxiety among our kids. COVID fatigue/frustration. Although most of the neighbors we engaged with love their community, expressions of fear popped up in many of our conversations. In Accompaniment lingo, these are known as *places of desolation*. Many of us probably experience some or all of these same fears.

Even as we continue the work of Accompaniment, we are moving into the next phase, that of Interpretation. This involves the rather daunting task of identifying what "core theological commitments" we, as a congregation, hold and then connecting our findings back to what we've learned in Accompaniment. For us to figure this out, we will be looking for input from you! In the coming weeks, look for opportunities to share what you see as St. Peder's core values/beliefs.

**XL Feet**, owner Adrian Coulter, 242 E Fillmore Ave, St Paul, 651-797-6000 <u>xlfeet.com</u>

XL Feet was as found out of necessity by Adrian who had size 16EE wide feet. His shoe size matched his age from 7 to 16. From 12 years on he had a hard time finding everyday shoes, dress shoes, boots, skates or other specialty footwear because he had extra large/wide feet. Few stores carried extra large

sizes so Adrian started his own store in 2008, but it wasn't easy. He spoke to hundreds of vendors but only one let him sell their shoes. Building the business was a slow process, initially he sold online out of his house. He now offers more than 50 brands of footwear, shoes, boots, sandals, slippers, and insoles in sizes 7-20 and in as many widths. If you or someone you know has a hard time finding shoes, Adrian understands and will help you find the best fitting width and/or size. Give him a call or checkout his website!
