In the Interim by Eric Luedtke, Interim Pastor Liminal Seasons, Prolepsis, the Now and Not Yet

Over the past few years we've heard use of phrases like "unprecedented times" or I coined the idea of "[insert adjective here] time" to describe the events surrounding us, particularly as COVID-19 dramatically impacted (and continues to impact) our lives.

Theologians have big words for these experiences as well.

Futurist Theologian Ted Peters writes about *prolepsis*, the idea that events of our lives are drawn into the future – he specifically notes the ways that Jesus life, death, and resurrection impact all of our futures through the impact Christ's forgiveness has on our heavenly future.

I've often used Peters' more "everyday language" of "the now and not yet" – that we live in a time where we know things to be true even if we haven't concretely experienced them for ourselves.

Contemplative Theologian Richard Rohr speaks of this phenomenon as *liminal seasons* in which we find ourselves between the known history of the past and the anticipated, but yet unpredictable, events of the future.


As a congregation, St. Peder's has been in just such a season. We've called it *Interim* or *Transition Time.*

For the past 18 months (likely longer) as a congregation we have been living in a season that holds us between what we knew and what is on its way. In fact we've experienced that season in overlapping ways through the transition of multiple staff members, through the impact of COVID-19, and the reality that over the past two years over a dozen long-time members have died. We know that what was will not return, but we also look forward to what will be – trusting that it is God who holds that future.

The transition to a new pastor has been happening over these 18 months. The work the Transition Team did set-up the countless hours that the Call Committee put in to narrow the candidates to the one the congregation will vote on. Through that time the Congregation Council has been continuing their work of moving the ministry of St. Peder's forward. Members of the congregation have all played important roles in maintaining and building relationships with one another – one of my favorite overheard comments at St. Peder's is "I never knew that about you" – people who have been members together for years are still digging deeper and learning more about one another.

As we prepare to welcome a new pastor to St. Peder's I invite you to take some time to think about what this *liminal season* of *transition time* has meant to you. What has happened in these last 18 months that you are excited about? What has happened that you wish would have been different? What is one thing that surprised you during this time? Take some time to think about those questions. Write them down. Share them with others. Share them with Council members, with me, with anyone who will listen. I bet we could fill a wall in Fellowship Hall with our answers.

We are hosting a performance of TUCKERS' ROBOT!!



RIH Update: June Reflection

Recently, as part of the Innovation Team's effort to get to know our neighbors, Lisa Rovick and Pastor Eric met with the executive director of Black Table Arts, Brittany Delaney. On its surface, Black Table Arts, which is located on Minnehaha Avenue, is a cooperative dedicated to gathering black communities through art, but Lisa and Pastor Eric learned from talking with Brittany that what they are doing goes much deeper, particularly in outreach to young people and in the public schools. They have an intense effort underway to provide "Mutual Aid" to anyone who reaches out, and Brittany starts all her interactions with a question: "What do you need?" According to Pastor Eric, "the 'Mutual Aid' piece blew me away. It makes perfect sense - in the past these kinds of requests often came directly to churches, but with the place of the church in culture sliding to the margins, having a group like Black Table Arts to fill that space helps provide a conduit for those who have the means and desire to help to assist those in need."

It sounds to me that Black Table Arts is a powerful model for what it means to be a good neighbor, to share good news with one's community. Our entire team hopes to meet soon with Brittany and explore ways that we at St. Peder's might be able to partner with Black Table Arts in an authentic and meaningful way. As building any relationship goes, this will take time and patience and lots of listening. We are open and excited to see where it could lead.
