Summer greetings!

I have been thinking about identity. This is partially because of our work with JustMOVE this year, but also digging into the experience of being part of the community that is St. Peder's. We are each unique, with our own experiences and our own perspectives based on those experiences. We each have our own ways of seeing the world and tackling the challenges that face all of us. And this diversity of experience and thought is a beautiful thing, especially in the Church. In Genesis 2:26-27, we read that God created humankind in the image of God and that all people bear that image. This inborne image of God means that God is experienced in diversity of thought, appearance, and sensation. While this image finds common ground, it also is very particular. It is one of those confounding and liberating "both/and" scenarios that our world is filled with; we are both common and particular. As Margaret Mead said, "Always remember that you are absolutely unique. Just like everyone else."

We might know that, but it is hard to practice. It is easy to think about ourselves as a nameless and faceless piece of a larger whole. It is so easy to think that we are not unique, not special, or, even worse, to understand our uniqueness as a hinderance. I'm not sure why people crave sameness, or we think of ourselves as a homogenous group, but we often do (myself included). We can get caught up in trying to be someone or something else and see ourselves, our bodies, and our thoughts as something to be conquered, rather than loved and valued. Social media, of course, has been blamed for this, but is predates Facebook by generations and centuries. In 1 Samuel, Israel demands that God choose a king for them, rather than judges, because they want to be like other nations. That was thousands of years ago.

Seeing ourselves as beloved image bearers of God is, I think, the first step to truly seeing the beauty in the diversity around us. Even in what we might describe as a homogenous group, each of us is different. Learning to see that difference as not only present, but holy and sacred, is a key piece of seeing ourselves as part of God's story. You are loved now, just as you are, not who you think you ought to be. God made you. God loves you. We start close in, loving our own uniqueness, so we can learn to see others with the eyes of God. This is a challenge, but it is also a promise, that God's love is always with you, no matter what you may go though.

JustMOVE Update

Part of our adventure with Dave and Joe from JustMove is about recognizing the cultural dimensions which exist among people and the diversity within these dimensions. Identifying our own unique characteristics enables us to begin to understand their influence in our interactions and their impact on our relationships. Our identity is based on characteristics from a variety of factors including family background, education, racial and gender identity, religion, age, abilities/disabilities, economic status, sexual orientation, ethnicity, language, and our home/ geographic roots, to name a few. Each of us has a unique identity which forms the basis for how we function in the world. If we each created a web of similarities among family, friends, and acquaintances, we would find shared traits with a variety of people, but no two webs would be the same. For example, someone with a Norwegian ethnicity may share that heritage with some member of St. Peder's, but not most. Or a person raised in a rural community or a child of divorce will share experiences with some but not all. Each of us has connections to others at St. Peder's, and our wider community, but no two of us have the same connections. We are a potpourri of people seeking to do God's work with open hearts, open hands, and open doors. The goal for our work with Dave and Joe is to learn about cultural competency and awareness. They are helping us understand culture at St. Peder's and how it intersects with visitors, neighbors, and individuals already in our community. By becoming more aware of our cultural similarities and learned biases, we can begin to improve our understanding and interactions with others.


