Hello from the Pastor's Office!

I've had a few conversations lately with people asking how the lessons are chosen each week. Sometimes, it feels like the lessons that we hear each week are tailor made to fit our situation and concerns. Other times, it can feel like the lessons are disjointed and picked at random. I will be honest that I also sometimes wonder what the lessons are trying to get at, packaged together as they are. And, for better or worse, I cannot claim any ownership of how they come to you.

At St. Peder's, we tend to use something called the Revised Common Lectionary (or RCL), which is a 3-year schedule of readings. Throughout the 3 years, we hit the major themes and stories of the Bible and the people who compiled the schedule (who came from several Christian denominations) have tried hard to make them coherent. Often, the formula is that the gospel is chosen, a lesson from the New Testament is chosen that fits the general themes of the gospel, the Old Testament (or Hebrew Bible) lesson will give added context to the gospel lesson, and the Psalm will be a reflection of the Old Testament lesson. Occasionally, they will do a series (such as we recently had in Ephesians and the 6 th chapter of John), but often the main series is the gospel. The RCL was introduced in 1994, but was preceded by several other lectionary lessons.

Now, this might be interesting, but it begs the question why we choose to use it. There are, after all, other lectionaries and many other churches will do a sermon series, which can be great way to dig in deep to a subject or longer passage. But I have found a lot of meaning and purpose behind the RCL. I love that, when I sit down to write a sermon, I am wrestling with the same lessons at thousands of other pastors. Across the world, there are Christians hearing the same consolations, challenges, and stories. Across denominations, political persuasions, language, culture, and life experiences, we are hearing the same good news. We gather at the same table, so to speak, and we each offer our own interpretation and insights. And it's not just pastors. You are also a part of this work, as you interpret, engage with, and apply what the Spirit teaches you.

The lessons we hear not only encourage and teach us, but are also expression of the universal Church which we share with more people than we could possibly meet. Just as we meet as a congregation, the Church meets around the Word, Water, and Table to experience grace and be sent out to love the world with God's own love. And I'm grateful to be a part of that with you.


