Greetings in the name of Christ,

Immigration has been a contentious issue in our politics, especially in the past few election cycles. It's a complex issue, with many moving parts and a lot of mixed feelings. This is nothing new. There are several passages that name immigrants, in addition to other vulnerable groups, as people that followers of God should care for (Matthew 25, Romans 12, Hebrews 13, Leviticus 19, James 2, and Deuteronomy 10 to name a few). In addition to the scriptural attention, St. Peder's recognizes that we started as a community of immigrants. Some of us are, in fact, naturalized citizens born in other countries. Given this background, I am hoping to see our congregation think deeply about the topic of immigration in the next few months. Through the ELCA's AMMPARO network and resources. we will be considering the complex topic of immigration and deciding what we are willing to do to care for people. AMMPARO is an acronym for "Accompanying Migrants and Minors with Protections. Advocacy, Representation, and Opportunities", as well as the Spanish word for "protection" (amparo).

You might be wondering why we'd be doing this now, on the edge of a busy Advent and Christmas. It might not be festive, but it is scriptural. Before the nativity scene, the story of Christmas starts with a displaced family. All of Israel was shaken up by the Roman emperor's demand of a census. The story of Jesus's birth is built upon a family forced from their homes and seeking refuge. The family of Jesus needed help, and they took it in whatever form it was offered, even if it meant Mary giving birth "away in a manger". In this context, I've heard people say things like, "If I were there in Bethlehem, I would have opened my doors. I would have helped." If you find yourself thinking this, I hope you'll be part of these conversations. Because we have a chance now to decide how we will respond to the needs of the world.

As we anticipate the birth of Jesus, I hope that we will use the love we have for him to care for others. As Christ, born to vulnerable people, cares for us, we are called to care for vulnerable people. And the story of Christmas is one that calls us to look in unexpected places, among often overlooked people, and see God there. I hope you'll be part of this process as we await, together, the birth of our Savior and care for our neighbors.

We will use our regularly scheduled Bible Study on Tuesdays at 6 pm for parts of this extended conversation. There are 6 parts to the Bible Study, so the dates of them will be December 3rd, 10th, and 17th, and January 7th, 14th, and 21st. If you can't be there for all of them, that's okay. We will also be having conversations following worship, hopefully with some special speakers. Stay tuned for

### **Advent Worship Schedule**

It's hard to believe, but Advent is right around the corner. We are excited to continue many important traditions at St. Peder's. The Children's Program and Gift Sunday will both be December 8th. The Song Service will be December 22nd, followed by dancing around the Christmas tree. Tuesday, December 24th is Christmas Eve and we will have worship services at 2 pm and 5 pm, with the Danish Juleaften service starting at 3:15. We will also have Wednesday service using Holden Evening Prayer at 7 pm on December 4th and 11th, and the Longest Night service on December 18th at 6:30 pm. The Longest Night service is for people who are experiencing complicated emotions and grief around the holiday. It's a space to hold both the joy of the day while acknowledging the hard experiences this time of year can hold.

### Gift Sunday

We will celebrate **Gift Sunday on December 8**, the day of the Children's Christmas Program. This year our gifts will help stock the pop-up holiday store at Plymouth Christian Youth Center (PCYC), where more than 600 north Minneapolis youth can choose gifts for their loved ones. Children are able to select up to five gifts for their family members, for a minimal fee, with a pre-purchased ticket. PCYC suggests new, unused items valued at \$10-25 for men, women, teenagers, children, and infants. PCYC serves many ethnic backgrounds so gifts that reflect diversity are prized. More specific gift ideas can be found on the Christmas tree outside the fellowship hall. Monetary donations are also accepted and used to purchase items for the sale. Our support will make the holiday season brighter for lots of families in our community.


