Hello from the Pastor's Office!

In the midst of all of the busyness of December, the new year can feel a bit like putting on a new pair of shoes. There is something exciting about it, but it also doesn't fit quite right yet. There is, of course, the malaise of putting away the holiday decorations and putting away the gifts. But there is often more than that. Like any big event, holidays do have a certain amount of introspection and processing that happens afterward. Perhaps this year, the holiday season felt different and, whether you know the reason why or not, it's left you with some questions. Maybe the heartfelt gift didn't land quite right, or the gatherings didn't go quite as expected. Maybe it's something else entirely.

It's important to remember that every year is different. Even if there are traditions that carry over from one year to the next, things will feel different because we are different. This past year has changed us in ways that we might not even be aware of yet, and that changes the way we experience things. And this can lead to a sense of grief or complicated feelings. But if the promises of Christmas mean anything at all, they mean that we worship a God, we follow a Christ, who knows and experiences those things with us. The story of Jesus's birth is the story of a God who refuses to remain aloof or detached, and that brings a sense of hope.

God loves you so much that God would give up choose to be a part of this world with us. And the manner that God joins us tell us that God is never far from what we experience. Jesus was born as we were, knew what it was like to be hungry and full, happy and sad, alone and in community. Jesus knows what it's like to grow up and, like we have experienced, what it's like to be changed by those experiences. And God remains committed to that. God has not given up.

Whether things went perfectly this past year or everything fell apart, God was with you. And the same is true for 2025. And just as 'God is with you, we are with each other. We will continue to work and learn, to comfort and challenge, and to experience this big, beautiful, messy world with each other as a community committed to God's good news. I know that God loves you and is with you. And I'm grateful we get to be in community with each other.

Twelfth Night Party




