Greetings in the name of Christ,

I am a big believer in the power of community. In fact, I believe that the call to community is essential to the proclamation of the gospel. It is essential to Christian faith to be in community with one another. Of course, this can look many different ways – sometimes it will be geographical and physical, other times it will be more remote – but the fact remains that nothing we have learned about God could be learned without the experience of community. Congregations proclaim the gospel to and with each other, through prayer, hymns, reading scripture, preaching sermons, and serving neighbors. The stories within the Bible are written within and for certain communities. The world we inhabit is shared with untold numbers of species, cultures, and individuals. If God has made us to be in community, then it means that we cannot be Christian without it. We cannot be whole by ourselves.

So many of the teachings of Jesus, the letters of the New Testament, the words of the prophet, and the laws of the Hebrew Bible address the needs of community. The words of religion are words of relationships. In fact, even the word "religion" comes from the word that would roughly translate at "reconnecting" ("re"-"ligia"). We cannot speak of righteousness, sin, or repentance (key terms as we approach Lent) without defining them, in some way, in relationship between ourselves, our neighbors, and God.

This is why having an understanding and a healthy practice of community are such a focus for me. This is why we're spending Lent studying the Sermon on the Mount, where Jesus speaks very intentionally and extensively about how his followers live with each other in community. We are doing it because without each other, we cannot be whole. Salvation is experienced not just by individuals, but by communities in concrete and mystifying ways.

Despite this, the limits of community are being tested. We are seeing both how fragile and how resilient they can be. We are seeing how fractured and how powerful they are. If we are to survive and thrive as individuals, we must depend on each other and we must build its foundations on something that is strong enough to withstand all the hardships that we face together. None of us can meet all the needs we see around us, but we do not face those needs alone. We have each other. And I'm grateful for that.


